A) WRITING AND DRAWING COMPETITIONS 2022

The grouping of students for drawing and writing will be as follows:

Group A [Class 11&12]	Group B [Classes 9&10]	Group C [Classes 7&8]

- 1) Drawing and writing Competitions will be conducted at two levels Zonal and Regional.
- 2) Schools of the zone will send the selected students names to the zonal I/C or host school. Since the competitions will be held simultaneously, one participant should not take part in two competitions.
- 3) All the zones will conduct the competition on the same date, day, timing and as per the topics given by the Secretary's office.
- 4) All participants of the zone will be assigned code numbers which they will write on their entry to enable impartial and independent evaluation. The name of participant, school name, school code etc must NOT be written. Entries violating this are liable to be disqualified
- 5) Those students who top the Region in Drawing and essay writing will be eligible to represent the region National ASISC Literary Events in Painting and Creative writing respectively.
- 6) Drawing is for Groups A to G –

The Topics for the drawing are to be given on the spot and the participants will be given only 60 minutes to complete the drawing. Participants up to class 4 can use crayons and from 5 to 12 will use water colours.

Essay Writing is for Groups A to E - Group A is to write 500 words, Groups B & C are to write 350 - 400 words. Groups D & E are to write 250 - 300 words. Topic to be given 1 hour before the actual writing.

<u>Short Story Writing is for Groups A to D</u> - Group A is to write 500 words, Groups B & C are to write 350 - 400 words. Groups D are to write 250 - 300 words. Topic to be given 1 hour before the actual writing.

<u>Poem Writing is for Groups A to C</u> – Poems should not exceed 30 lines. Topic to be given 1 hour before the actual writing.

<u>**Caption Writing: Group.**</u> C The picture will be displayed on the smart screen for the students. (refer to the guidelines for caption writing given separately)

7) The sample list attached herewith should be sent to zonal school head on or before the last date specified to enable the host school for making the arrangements.

- 4. Maximum length of the caption is 5 words.
- 5. Caption should be in English only.
- 6. The caption should be catchy and original and convey the meaning of the photograph.
- 7. Spelling mistakes will be checked.
- 8. Punctuation marks may be used. Punctuation mark will not be counted as word.
- 9. Caption may be in lower upper case
- 10. Caption should not contain any offensive word.
- 11. Three best participants will be selected for the regional level from each zone.

DEBATE (ZONAL, REGIONAL & NATIONAL LEVEL)

Juniors (Classes IX & X)

Seniors (Classes XI & XII).

- 1. Each member school can present TWO participants each in each category ONE for the motion and another AGAINST the motion.
- 2. Participants should avoid reading from a previously prepared script, any paper or aid.
- 3. Each zone can present only two participants each in each category one to speak 'for the motion' and the other, 'against' the motion.
- 4. The order of speaking will be decided on the spot by draw of lots. However, the speakers who initiate both the motions will get two extra minutes each to wind up the debate after all the speakers have finished their turn.
- 5. Each speaker will get F**our** minutes to speak. At the end of the T**hird** minute, a warning bell will be rung. The final bell will be sounded at the end of the F**ourth** minute.
- 6. Timing will start as soon as the participant starts speaking.
- 7. Speaking for less than 3 minutes and more than four minutes will entail a deduction of five marks by each judge.
- 8. All participants must be in formal wear without any identification marks.
- 9. The speakers will address the chair only. Un-parliamentary language, personal comments or observations on any religion, caste, community, political party or individual are not allowed; the matter should be limited to the topic only. Such violations may lead to disqualification.
- 10. Marks awarded by individual judges will be added up for each speaker. The best speakers For / Against the motion at the zonal level will represent the zone in the regional and the best speakers (for/against) in the regional level will represent the region at the National Competition.
- 11. Speakers will be adjudged on the following criteria:

DECLAMATION 2022 (ZONAL, REGIONAL & NATIONAL LEVEL)

Seniors (Classes XI & XII).

- 1. Each member school can present one participant each in each category.
- 2. Each speaker will be given F**our** minutes to speak. At the end of three minutes 30 seconds, a warning bell will be rung. The final bell will be sounded at the end of the F**ourth** minute.
- 3. Speaking for less than 3 minutes 30 seconds and more than four minutes will entail a deduction of five marks by each judge.
- 4. Choice of passage is left to the participants but NO PASSAGE FROM FICTION OR DRAMA IS PERMITTED.
- 5. Participants should avoid reading from a previously prepared script, any paper or aid.
- 6. Participants should be in formal wear without any identification marks of school.
- 7. Marks awarded by individual judges will be added up for each speaker.
- 8. In charge for the zonal level
 - Zonal in charges
 - Only first 2 from each zone will go to the final at the Region.
 - Zonal level mark will be submitted to the secretary.
- 9. The best participant from the region will go to national level ASISC in all three categories
- 10. The speaker will be judged on the following criteria:

- 6. 3 member judges will be appointed to decide the best 2 entries at the regional level.

- 6. The participants will be adjudged based on confidence, expression, fluency, intonation, and voice modulation.
- 7. 3 judges shall be present for the whole time to evaluate and declare the best 2 entries from the zone.

- 7. 3 judges are to be appointed to select the best TWO entries at the zonal level and send for Regional level
- 8. Regional level will be evaluated by a team of 3 judges.
